12.1 General project introduction	Req'd By	Due
Dan Ramirez introduced the design team. The design team then explained that the purpose of this meeting is to present progress on the library's design to date, present the building's exterior character, and gather feedback from the community via a brief survey.		
12.2 Interactive Survey		
5 survey questions were asked with instant results being shown. See attachment for the questions and results. It is understood that these are just a snapshot of who was at the meeting and not representative of the community at large.		
12.3 Community Comments		
The following are a summary of community comments:		
 Generally like the feel and design of the building Like the location of the library on the corner of Fort Smallwood Road and Duvall highway General feeling is that the exterior character of the library fits the scale, 		

feel and context of the local community

- The outdoor area is lovely, but can it have a canopy or umbrellas for shade on hot summer days?
- Consider blocking off outdoor area from parking lot for safety reasons
- Desire for roof garden
- Desire for water wall or some other water feature outside the library
- Concerns about noise from Fort Smallwood Road
 - O The design team responded by explaining that the highly insulated and efficient wall and storefront glazing systems would be excellent sound insulators from the exterior.
- Desire to keep and/or have more trees along Fort Smallwood Road
- Would like to see some red brick on the exterior or just more brick in general
- Concern about having a flat (low-slope) roof in this climate due to snow/water causing leaks
 - The design team responded by explaining that this type of roof allows room for mechanical equipment on the roof. These roofs are also fairly common in this region and the PVC roof membrane systems we specify are high performance and don't have performance issues like older low-slope roof systems.
- Concern about ensuring there are multiple entries and exits for egress in case of emergency
 - O The design team responded by explaining that the building must be designed to meet building and life safety codes that define the size and quantity of doors in order for everyone in the building to be able to egress safely in an emergency.
- Concern about cars being able to hit the building from Fort Smallwood Road
 - The design team responded by explaining that the building is much higher than the road and therefore it would be difficult for a vehicle to hit the building. Defensive landscaping could also be used to mitigate this concern.
- There are desires for additional safety measures for students and other pedestrians to cross Duvall Highway, such as another crosswalk
- Concern about kids being able to escape from kid's area
 - The design team responded by explaining that these doors would typically be on an alarm to alert staff if someone used these doors to exit the building.
- Have other shapes been explored for the tower, such as octagonal or circular towers, in addition to the square tower that was presented?
- What types of seating are being provided for adults for congregating, reading, adult book club, using laptops, etc.?
 - The design team responded by identifying the lounge space and laptop bar in the lobby, the private reading spaces along the exterior wall at Fort Smallwood Road and the various study rooms.




1. Do you believe the nautical/Chesapeake Bay character is appropriate for the new Riviera Beach Community Library?


2. Does the new design preserve the friendly appearance and feeling desired by the community?


3. Locating the new library at the corner of Fort Smallwood and Duvall Highway makes it more visible – Do you believe presence at the corner is important and desirable?
