Also, starting on April 8, we will transition to a new library management system — or in other words, a new way to manage checkouts, our catalog of materials and your library account. Not only will it save thousands of dollars in software costs – it'll help library staff serve you better. The upgrades to our system require us to close to customers on April 6 and 7.

The new system will also include an updated online catalog of books, movies and more. These changes are almost all cosmetic and you should notice only slight changes in the way you use our catalog. We'll post more details about the catalog changes on the library website soon.






